KULZE SCHOLARSHIP

As most of our membership is aware, former Chicago Society President, now deceased, Jim Kulze, and his wife, Lillian, generously endowed a scholarship fund as part of the Chicago Society Foundation that would be available for meaningful scholarships to worthy college and graduate school candidates with financial need. The Committee selected Emily Bienasz, attending Springfield College, Springfield, Massachusetts, Veronica Materna and Karolina Truszkowska, both attending Loyola University in Chicago, as the 2019 Kulze Scholars. Each will receive \$7,500. Their essays are being printed in several Forums.

This month is the essay from Veronica Materna.

The world is a truly wonderful place with many different groups of people. Although I have only lived a fifth of my life, I am extremely happy to have already met a great number of diverse people. I consider talking to them and learning about their different traditions and ideas as a true blessing and my passion in life. My interactions with these individuals opens up my eyes and heart in a way that allows me to see our world from different perspectives.

Most of these experience has been one I achieved in the Chicagoland area. As a first generation Polish-American, I have been in contact with not only my Polish and American cultures, but other cultures as well. Living in a diverse city, I am able to greatly cherish my friendships and connections with other cultural groups. Moreover, as a Polish folklore dancer in Wici Song and Dance Theater, I am able to share my Polish culture through dance. Once a year, Wici and I have the privilege of partaking in international folklore festivals where we are given the opportunity to learn more about other ethnicities and their cultures. Through these festivals, I learn about both the host country's culture and the cultures of the other folklore dance groups.

When looking at my life, I noticed that I have a passion for different cultures and giving back to the community. As a way to live the rest of my life by doing what I love, I am seeking a Bachelor's degree in History and a Bachelor's in Global and International Studies at Loyola University Chicago. Moreover, because I challenge myself to become the best version of myself, I am part of the Honors Program, an interdisciplinary program at Loyola. Even though I have learned about the language, grammar, history, and geography of Poland in Saturday Polish school, I am likewise minoring in Polish studies. I would like to continue learning about my culture so that I could provide myself with more resources to greatly help the Polish population in the future.

This past fall semester, I was given the opportunity to study abroad in Rome, Italy. It was a blessing to not only have the opportunity to meet different people from around the world, but to likewise continue my studies outside of the United States. I think it was important for me to have learned about international organizations such as the European Union outside of the United States. The entire experience has opened up my eyes and made me appreciate how globalized our world truly is.

It was incredibly interesting to meet and discuss with these intellectual individuals. Not only was I able to contribute to the discussion, but I learned a little bit more on the injustice of women in the Polish society. I will cherish the memories and knowledge that I gained throughout the symposium forever.

for the students who are taking a Polish language course at Loyola, I am likewise working on a political and historical paper under the guidance of Professor Suszko, a professor who specializes in Eastern European history, especially Polish history. Titled, the "Myth and memory of the Polish Underground State in Post-Communist Poland," this research paper will explain how both tits Polish Underground State and the more recently glorified Polish Armed Forces during the Second World War affect Poland's contemporary politics. It is a complex topic, but it is one which I believe is an important one to research.

After I obtain my undergraduate degree, my goal is to attend law school to either became an immigration lawyer or an international lawyer. Since the world is becoming more globalized and there are more and more problems emerging with each given day, I want to dedicate my life trying to help relieve those situations. I desire to beneficially impact as many lives as I possibly can. Human rights are incredibly important in today's world. It is a shame that it is not a priority in some parts of the world and/or in some situations. My job will be to make these rights more known — if not everywhere, then in some parts of the world. As Jean de La Fontaine once said, "People must help one another; it is nature's law."

Before attending law school, however, I would like to teach abroad. Since I know that it is important to enrich oneself in different cultures, I believe this would be an advantageous opportunity for me and my future career.
