CHICAGO SOCIETY PHEASANT HUNTING OUTING



Saturday, November 21st 8 to Noon! Join fellow hunting enthusiasts for our inaugural hunting outing. Late Fall is a perfect time to pheasant hunt and the Chicago Society has arranged for a great experience for members and friends in one of Northern Illinois' premier hunt clubs, Coon Creek. The cost will be \$125.00 per person and our event is limited to the first twenty hunters who deliver their reservation form with a check payable to the PNA-Chicago Society. The hunt will include a guide and three birds per hunter.* All hunters will also need to have in their possession a

one-day hunting license with a habitat stamp.* Licenses are not available at the Club. Coon Creek Hunt Club is located at 11050 Slough Road, Garden Prairie, Illinois 61038 (near Marengo, IL). We will be meeting at 7:45 sharp for check-in, release signing, and field assignments. Loaner guns are available on a limited basis on a first-come-first-served basis and arrangements will need to be made prior to the day of the hunt. Only non-toxic shot is allowed and is available for purchase at the Club. Professional guides with seasoned dogs will be provided for each group as needed. Of course, if you have a hunt-trained dog, you are encouraged to use it.

After the event please stay for a chili lunch and to share pictures and stories of the hunt.*Additional pheasants are available at \$25/per bird. Please inquire about availability and cost of chucker, quail and partridge.



TRAIL OF HOPE THE ANDERS ARMY, AN ODYSSEY ACROSS THREE CONTINENTS

A NEW BOOK BY NORMAN DAVIES

Following the conquest of Poland by Nazi Germany and the Soviet Union in 1939, hundreds of thousands of Polish families were torn from their homes and sent eastwards to the arctic wastes of Siberia. Prisoners of war, refugees, those regarded as 'social criminals' by Stalin's regime, and those rounded up by sheer chance were all sent 'to see the Great White Bear'. However, with Hitler's invasion of the Soviet Union in Operation Barbarossa just two years later, Russia and the Allied powers found themselves on the same side once more. Turning to those that it had previously deemed 'undesirable', Russia sought to raise a Polish army from the men, women and children that it had imprisoned within its labour camps.

In this remarkable work, renowned historian Professor Norman Davies draws from years of meticulous research to recount the compelling story of this unit, the Polish II Corps or 'Anders Army', and their exceptional journey from the Gulag of Siberia through Iran, the Middle East and North Africa to the battlefields of Italy to fight shoulder-to-shoulder with Allied forces. Complete with previously unpublished photographs and first-hand accounts from the men and women who lived through it, this is a unique visual and written record of one of the most fascinating episodes of World War II.
