Time is quickly running out to reserve a spot at Chicago Society PNA Lodge #1450's Evening of Elegance, the highlight of the midwinter social calendar! January 20 is the deadline to make your reservations for this widely-anticipated event, which will be held on Saturday evening, January 28, at the Park Ridge Country Club, 636 N. Prospect Ave. Tickets are \$150 per person, or \$1,500 for a table of ten. This event is "Black Tie Optional," so either tuxedos or business suits are acceptable for the men—and appropriately dressy clothing for the ladies.

The evening will kick off at 6 p.m. with a cocktail hour and hors d'oeuvres, followed by dinner at 7 p.m. There are three options available for dinner—Petit Filet and Chicken Francaise; Salmon and Chicken Picatta; or Vegetarian.

The official program begins at 8:30 p.m. with the induction of the Chicago Society's officers for 2023. Continental/Ballroom dancing will be featured, with music provided by the Anthony Kawalkowski Orchestra—headed by a brother member of the Society who is an accomplished violinist. The Lechici Polish Dancers troupe will also perform at the event; and Chicago Society will also honor the Legion of Young Polish Women for their history of good works for Poland and Chicago's Polonia—which dates back more than 80 years, to the opening days of World War II, when they helped provide relief for Polish victims of the war; and continues today with assistance to those now in Poland who were displaced by the Russian attack on Ukraine that began in February 2022.

Finally, the Chicago Society will also be presenting its first annual Ro Matuszczak Member of the Year Award, in honor of our longtime brother member who belonged to the Society for over 65 years, and who passed away in 2022 at the age 97. The award is designed to honor a member who has gone above and beyond the call of duty in assisting the Society with its activities that are held throughout the year.

Lira Ensemble Offering Two Tours of Poland This Summer

For anyone interested in visiting Poland this summer, the Lira Ensemble is sponsoring two tours—one in the south of the country, and the other in the north.

A 14-day tour of southern Poland will take place from June 22—July 6, and will include visits to Warsaw, Krakow, Lodz, Czestochowa, Wroclaw, Zakopane and Wadowice (hometown of Pope John Paul II). The 13-day tour of northern Poland will be offered from July 13–26 and will include Warsaw, Gdansk, the Tri-City area, Poznan, Bialystok, the Bialowieza Forest, Torun, and Malbork Castle. Both the northern and southern tours will also feature a visit to the birthplace of Frederic Chopin, in Zelazowa Wola, west of Warsaw.

March 1 Is the Deadline to Apply for PNA's Kulze Scholarships

The deadline to apply for the Kulze Scholarships sponsored by the Chicago Society Foundation is fast approaching! Wednesday, March 1 is the last day for initial applications to be accepted. The Foundation, affiliated with the Chicago Society PNA Lodge #1450, is funding four scholarships totaling \$22,500 for the 2023-24 academic year, through the Kulze Scholarship Fund. One of the scholarships is for \$7,500; the other three are for \$5,000 each. After the initial applications are accepted, selections will be made in April for the Fall 2023 Semester. Former Chicago Society President James Kulze and his wife, Lillian, generously endowed the fund to provide meaningful scholarship support benefitting worthy students of Polish descent every year. Lech Walesa, Protesting in Mexico City, Says Communism 'Is a Mistake' and Must End

Former Polish President and 'Solidarity' leader Lech Walesa was among those taking part in a recent protest against the Communist government of Cuba outside its embassy in Mexico, after eight people trying to escape Cuba—including a 2-year-old girl—drowned when their makeshift raft was rammed by a Cuban government coast guard vessel in October.

Walesa was in Mexico City in mid-November to attend and advise Mexico's first "Conservative Political Action Conference," attended by people from several Latin American countries who oppose Communist and socialist regimes in their homelands, and who wish to institute economic and political freedoms there.

While protesting in front of the Cuban embassy, Walesa and several others were confronted by a pro-Communist group carrying flagpoles with hammer-and-sickle insignias that tried to attack them while chanting "These streets belong to Fidel!" (a reference to the late Cuban dictator Fidel Castro), and "No gusanos!" (a Spanish word for "maggots," which Castro's supporters use to describe their opponents). Mexican police intervened to prevent any serious injuries.

"I am very impatient that Communism continues to govern in Cuba and the regime is still there," Walesa said. "As you all know, I led a struggle against Communism, and we defeated Soviet Communism—but as you see, Communism still exists in some places. That is why I call on the government of Cuba to end its Communist regime; stop killing the Cuban people. Communism is a mistake."

Walesa said that Communism "has slogans and nothing else, and that is why it can't manage without force, without an army. It doesn't have a good program and doesn't come with good ideas. Beware of slogans, because they always propagate them, but they never keep their promises. They never fulfill them and they're not going to fulfill them. The ideas of Communism seem very good, but I have never seen the promises fulfilled."

The 79-year-old former president, who was a shipyard electrician in Gdansk when he became a leader of 'Solidarity,' and who won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1983, noted that he himself had lived under a Communist regime for over four decades. "I know it well!" he remarked.
