## 1st Place Essay — 2014 Chicago Society Scholarship Winner

Over the next two months we will publish the essays of the 2014 Chicago Society Scholarship winners. Mr. Adam Rozanek, a second year fulltime student at the University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana majoring in Accounting, submitted the following essay that won first place in the 2014 scholarship. The Chicago Society and Chicago Society Foundation awarded Adam a check for \$3,000.00 at the CS May 3rd Polish Constitution Day Pre parade brunch:

Growing up in a family where the only known language is Polish; I was surrounded by Polish culture, heritage, and traditions my whole life. I'm the only one in my family that was born outside of Poland as my parents immigrated to the United States to escape communism. Because my parents had to make a living they found jobs right away which did not give them time to learn English. Because of this; my first language was Polish and I went into elementary school not knowing English.

This was one of my first challenges in life as I was in school and I did not understand anything that was going on. I kept quiet; and it was not until a week into the school year when the teacher recognized that I did not speak English so I was put into a special program. What usually lasts three years; I was able to get back into the regular program in one year and by fourth grade I was in the gifted program. During my time in grade school I was already involved with Polish heritage because of my parents. They wanted to make sure that I knew as much as I could about Polish heritage even though we were away from the homeland.

One of the first Polish organizations I joined was the Polonia dance group. We practiced traditional Polish dances such as the Krakowiak and we put on shows across the Chicago land area. Another group that I joined was named Wieczernik. This is a theatrical group in which we put on plays about religion; however some also have to do with Polish culture. An example of this was when we did a play about John Paul II which we displayed across the Chicago-land area. Our most popular play; however, is the Passion of the Christ which we still put on today during the time of lent and we get extraordinary turnouts. Both of these groups spread Polish heritage across Chicago land.

By the time high-school came around I was serious about my studies and I got into the International Baccalaureate Programme, which is a vigorous program with an emphasis on biodiversity. We learned about many countries; and

many times we gave projects on our home-land. My projects of course; were always on Poland. I will never forget when I impressed my AP History teacher when I made a project on communism in Poland. I presented it in front of the whole class and everybody was in shock as I gave first-person stories on communist Poland that my parents told me.

I was surprised to see that my very own history teacher did not know of what went on in Poland during communism and that made me see that everybody else is oblivious to what really went on. Of course; there are textbooks that tell you what happened but hearing the stories from people that had to live through those times such as my parents are a much different experience. I'll never forget when my mom told me how they tied a body slain by the government on a door across the whole city of Gdynia in opposition to communism. There were other stories such as police raiding my parent's house or not being able to buy milk for their children. I actually have an interview with my parents on YouTube in which they go in depth about what they had to go through during communism. I even had someone email me to use those videos as a source which I agreed to.

Learning about communist Poland from my parents and doing that project really affected my interest in Poland's history. I actually started paying attention during History class on Saturday mornings in Polish school. I never knew how long and rich Poland's history is; and it really is a shame that children do not learn about it in school. Because of this, I decided to get more involved with the Polish culture and heritage.

Every summer for the past couple of years I have been going to a place named Camp Vista. This is a Polish camp for children but it also has a religious aspect to it. At this camp I am in charge of a group of about ten kids. In addition to supervising the kids we also have to teach them. Every day we have group meetings during which we discuss respect towards others, religion, and Polish heritage. My goal in being a counselor at this camp is to have these kids connect to God and to also have pride in being Polish.

Currently I am studying at the University of Illinois in Champaign and I am very involved with the Zagloba Polish Club. This past winter we organized a Wigilia that was open to everybody. We even got a Polish priest to come from

## 13 QUESTIONS SELF PORTRAIT INTERVIEW

I conducted a straightforward Q & A with Brother **Mark Pasieka** about his life, reflections and experiences. It is an interesting in depth expose of Brother Mark. I hope you enjoy reading it. [Editor's note: Brother Mark's family owned and operated the famous Pasieka Bakery on Milwaukee Avenue in the Jackowo area for many years.]

Where were you born? *In the Jackowo area of Chicago.*

Family background (parents alive or deceased, brothers and sisters), marital status? *Father passed April 11, 2012; Mother lives in Phoenix more than in Poland these days. Brother lives in Phoenix and my two older brothers passed away. I am married to Renata and we have three children - Emma, Andzelina and Mark.*

When did you move to Chicago and for what reason? *I moved back in 2006 because my wife insisted on it.*

What is your educational background and current position in your profession? *High school: Northridge Preparatory for Boys, Bachelors: University of Arizona, Electrical engineering and Masters: Arizona State University, Electrical Engineering / Electromagnetics. I am currently: working on developing acoustic optic modulators and deflectors (my own business).*

When did you join the Chicago Society and who were your sponsors? *I have been a part of the Polish society my entire life, a month ago I joined the subset of that group, the brotherhood that identifies itself as the Chicago Society by the sponsorship of Mark Orwat and Robert Groszek.*

How would you improve the Chicago Society? *I have not been a member long enough to have an opinion on this. I usually avoid*

*improving things unless they are broken or can easily, and without possibility of failure, provide additional features, at minimal cost.*

Do you have childhood or school nickname? *My white friends called me Pasieka and my black friends called me Pooshacka (I think it was a derivation of Shaka Zulu as that was on TV when my black friends started calling me that.).*

On a scale from 1 to 10 how important is your Polish Heritage? *I may have been assembled in the United States but my components are all imported from Poland. Nothing else seems to fit or is just simply incompatible so I would say 10, very important.*

What other organizations do you support and take an active role in? *Jackowo parish, NDFA and the Pumping station one.*

Do you have strong religious beliefs? *I believe so, but compared to most I am a sinner.*

Which would you prefer, a street named in your honor or a postage stamp? *A Street is more long term. It would be nice to be remembered, but having a street named after me is not my objective in life.*

Which actor would you chose to play the role in a movie about you and your life? *My Son, he's the best actor I have observed to-date. My brother isn't bad but my son is only 4.*

If they made a mixed drink in your honor, what would be in it? *Miód Pitny and something ... I'll have to get back to you on that one ... I haven't tried mixing it with anything. Then again, when I ferment it I have found adding cherry syrup, currants and gooseberries varies the flavor enough to almost make it something else.*

Chicago to give mass. After the mass we had the Wigilia with an astonishing turn out. We had over 350 people and many of them were not Polish. This was a fun experienced as we showed them what to do with the *opłatek* and explained why there are no dishes with meat.

This event, along with many others has really spread Polish culture around the campus here at the University of Illinois. There are over two-hundred people in the club now and the people that are involved the most (including me) live in the same apartment complex. It feels like a second family because our Polish club is very close. Thanks us being close to each other; a couple of my friends and I are working on a video in which we will have first person stories about communism in Poland. Many of the students here have older parents or grandpa rents that lived through communism and I think it's imperative to get their stories because there is an extraordinary amount of people that do not know what happened in communist Poland.

I have been surrounded by Polish customs and traditions ever since I've been born and they have followed me all the way to college. I played on the Wisła soccer team and I walked

in every May 3rd parade. My whole life I have been smothered with Polish culture and I try my best to display it for others to learn about it. I will continue spreading Polish customs and traditions during my time here at the University of Illinois as next year I am hoping to be President of Zagloba. One thing in particular I am focusing on spreading is the history of Poland as many people do not know how fascinating it is.
