POLISH CONSTITUTION DAY PRE-PARADE BRUNCH

The Chicago Society's Annual Polish Constitution Day Pre-Parade Brunch will be held **on Saturday, May 3, 2013**, in the Grand Ballroom of the Hilton Chicago, 720 S. Michigan Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. The cost of the brunch is **\$30.00 per person**. Reception will be at 8:45 a.m., seating at 9:45 a.m., and a delicious plated brunch will be served at 10:00 a.m.

Brother **Mark Orwat** will present monetary awards to our scholarship recipients, who will be announced by Scholarship Chairman Brother **Charles A. Komosa**. The parade is scheduled to step off at 11:30 a.m. from Columbus and Balbo Drives, across from the Hilton. This is the 123rd Chicago parade in honor of this historic document, the first democratic constitution in Europe and second in the world only to the United States Constitution. The Parade is once again expected to draw 250,000 eager revelers to the lakefront.

The Chicago Society will have a float and marching unit in the Parade. There will be a band on the float and space for some persons to sit. Those members who will not attend the brunch but will march can contact Chairman Ro Matuszczak as to our place in the parade. Information on the day of the event can also be obtained from any parade marshal. Preferred attire for the marchers is gray slacks, dark jacket, red tie and white shirt. ASTRONAUT JAMES PAWELCZYK TO BE SPEAKER AT PAA EVENT

Chicago (PMN)—The Polish American Association (PAA) presents its annual Chairman's Brunch on April 27, 2014, at the prestigious The Standard Club, 320 South Plymouth Court, Chicago, Illinois. Tickets are \$500 per person.

The speaker this year is James ("Jim") A. Pawelczyk, who will share his inspirational story on his distinguished career as an astronaut and academician, but also how he has taken such pride in his Polish identity.

Pawelczyk, born September 20, 1960, is an American researcher of physiology and kinesiology who flew aboard the NASA STS-90 Space Shuttle mission as a Payload Specialist. Pawelczyk is the first astronaut of full-blooded Polish descent to go into space. Proud of his heritage, he brought a Polish Flag with him on Neurolab, which was later presented to the President of Poland on May 3, 1999.

Born in Buffalo, New York, Pawelczyk graduated from Iroquois Central High School, Elma, New York, in 1978. He went on to earn two Bachelor of Arts degrees in biology and psychology from the University of Rochester, New York in 1982. At Pennsylvania State University he earned a Master of Science degree in physiology in 1985, and a doctor of

philosophy degree in biology (physiology) from the University of North Texas in 1989. He completed a post-doctoral fellowship at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center in 1992.

An Associate Professor of Physiology and Kinesiology at Penn State University in University Park, Pennsylvania, since 1995, Dr. Pawelczyk took leave from Penn State University to fly as a payload specialist on the NASA STS-90 (Neurolab) from April 17 to May 3, 1998. During the 16-day Spacelab flight the seven person crew aboard the Space Shuttle Columbia served as both experiment subjects and operators for 26 individual life science experiments focusing on the effects of microgravity on the brain and nervous system. The STS-90 flight orbited the Earth 256 times, covered 6.3 million miles, and logged over 381 hours in space.
