August 2017 Speaker & Dinner Meeting -"Italian Night"

Our speaker for the August General Meeting will be Richard Owsiany, President of the Polish Museum of America. The meeting will be held

on Wednesday, August 16, 2017, at the White Eagle. Cocktail hour starts at 6:00 p.m. with dinner meeting starting at 7:00. Mr. Owsiany will speak about the exhibit which the Museum is hosting of the paintings and photographs of Zdzisław Beksiński, a unique historical event. Although Zdzislaw Beksinski's works are in the private collections of Roman Polanski, Chip Joslin,



Beata Tyszkiewicz, Jerzy Skolimowski, and Donald Sutherland, and are esteemed by the director Guillermo del Toro, their exhibition in the Polish Museum is the first time they are presented in the United States.

Since October 15, 2017, marks the 200th anniversary of the death of General Tadeusz Kościuszko (1746-1817). Mr. Owsiany will also speak about the Bicentennial exhibit honoring the military leader and engineer, who fought for independence, democracy, and equality, and is beloved in both America and Poland. In honor of his bicentennial, UNESCO declared 2017 as the Year of Kościuszko. As the PMA Archives holds an extensive collection of more than 90 original, handwritten and signed letters by Kościuszko, President Thomas Jefferson, American Revolution generals and other notables of the time, as well as broadsides, periodicals, and a wide assortment of lithograph portraits of the American and Polish hero – an exhibit featuring these items is scheduled for Fall 2017-Spring 2018.

Mr. Owsiany was born and raised in Chicago. He graduated from De-Paul University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Management, and then attended Keller Graduate School of Management. He is a graduate of Ignacy Paderewski Polish Language School. He is currently employed by the Chicago Transit Authority in the Law Department, responsible for contract and labor relations. He worked for the Chicago City Council as Chief Legislative Analyst on the Committee on Intergovernmental Relations chaired by Ald. Roman Pucinski. He has been involved in Polonia activities since childhood. He is active in Związek Harcerstwa Polskiego pgk as an instructor–harcmistrz, and serves in a number of leadership roles at the local, national and international level.


FAMILY AND FRIENDS PICNIC - FOOD, FOLKS, AND FUN!

BY-LAWS, PRIVACY POLICY APPROVED

The Board of the Chicago Society recently approved changes to the Society's By-laws, including the addition of a Privacy Policy Statement, which is published below, and is effective immediately. The complete revised By-laws can be found on our website http://chicagosocietypna.org/bylaws.html.

Any and all personally identifiable information ("PII") collected by the Chicago Society of the Polish National Alliance ("Society"), which may include but is not limited to e-mail addresses, will be used for the exclusive purpose of contacting and identifying members in order to further the Society's objectives. Permitted uses of collected PII include but are not limited to facilitating member communications, publishing a member directory, providing event or other notifications and distributing a newsletter. Any Society member wanting to limit the distribution or use of their PII should submit said request in writing to the board of directors ("Board") clearly outlining the scope and reason for the requested limitation(s.). The Board will review any limitation requests and facilitate any approved limitations within three (3) months of receipt of said request. As a condition of membership, all Society members, both past and present, have agreed not to disseminate the PII of any members, past or present, collected by the Society, however obtained. No member shall disseminate any PII obtained or collected by the Society to any non-member without the written consent of the member whose PII is to be disseminated. Any member found by a majority vote of the Board to have disseminated or utilized PII collected by the Society in violation of this policy is subject to discipline to be determined by a majority vote of the Board.
