1ST PLACE ESSAY — 2016 CHICAGO SOCIETY SCHOLARSHIP WINNER BY DANIELA KAPUSTA

What did Solidarność and the fall of communism in Poland mean to you and your family?

All four of my grandparents were born in Poland, and faced significant personal hardships under communism and during the Second World War. They worked hard to help their respective families survive and start a new life. Throughout all of this, they saw the promise of an American way of life. Each of them followed a unique path to Chicago, including detours through Siberia, Egypt, and England. Once in Chicago, they established stable home lives and started families. My parents are the result of that stability, being born as first-generation Americans, who continue to proudly recognize their Polish roots through active participation in numerous social and philanthropic organizations in Chicago's Polonia. My parents have personally experienced the birth of Solidarność and fall of communism on numerous trips to visit family members who still live in Poland. They have witnessed long lines for rationed basic necessities, and tell stories of relatives buying luxuries on the underground, black market, at significant markup.

By the time I traveled to Poland for my first time, communism had fallen and the overall economic and political situation had begun to improve. However, even at a very young age, I was able to notice minor differences from how I had grown up and what I was used to. For example, family members did not even have a microwave or mobile phone. Some family members did not even have a home telephone line. It felt like I had stepped backwards in time. Credit cards were not yet widely accepted, and home loans were still a foreign concept. On a visit several years later, Poland began to feel more like America, but with a deeper heritage. There were many more opportunities for lower and middle class families. Younger family members, who would have historically been only expected to be farmers or factory workers, were now pursuing higher education and professional roles. Elimination of communism resulted in relaxed government control, allowing some family members to open businesses. Everyone shopped at big malls and Hypermarkets, with many globally recognizable goods and brands. They were buying houses and using credit cards. Borders were opened for travel throughout the European Union, which resulted in increased cultural experiences.

My grandparents were forced to change due to war, but Solidarność helped initiate change again, but now in a primarily non-violent approach through strikes and protests. This new approach and peaceful diligence led to the downfall of communism, and a better quality of life for my family members still living in Poland. Solidarność has allowed them to live a Western life, with many opportunities, all without having to abandon their homeland and heritage. So much so, that my maternal grandparents even moved back to Poland for their retirement.
