A SUCCESSFUL START TO A NEW YEAR: RECAPPING THE EVENING OF ELEGANCE

We celebrated our annual "Evening of Elegance" on Saturday, Jan. 28, held for the second consecutive year at the Park Ridge Country Club. Our annual induction of officers was held, which this year include: President, Christopher T. Grzadziel; 1st Vice President, Zenon Kurdziel; 2nd Vice President, Andrew Haszlakiewicz; Financial Secretary, Jan Plachta; Treasurer, Ray Golenia; Senior Director, Adam Konopka; and FORUM Editor, Terry Przybylski. Swearing in the new officers was Judge Ed Wasilewski.

The program included the presentstion of the first-ever Romuald Matuszczak Member of the Year Award, to Br. Richard Ciesla. This award is given to the member whose work in support of the Society in the prior year most exemplified the spirit of our late brother, 'Ro' Matuszczak, who was an active member of the Society for 66 years and a 7-time President, prior to his passing away last year at age 97. As a tribute to Br. Ro and his family (who were in attendance), a Polonia Song and Dance Ensemble performed two songs.

This year's Member of the Year Award recipient, despite not being on the Board, attended all Board meetings, and carried out the duties of the Financial Secretary despite not holding that title. In addition to stepping in to help with that vacant position, he served as a critical member of the golf outing committee, and took an active part in all the club's events and volunteer opportunities. Although not attending the event in person, Br. Ciesla was able to receive his award via a ZOOM link, with his family accepting it in person from the Matuszczak family.

The Society then honored the Legion of Young Polish Women for their contributions to Polonia, and presented them with a \$2,000 donation. The program concluded with a wonderful performance by the Lechici Dancers of the Polish Scouting organization. While they donated their performance, the Society surprised them with a \$500 donation from the Youth Fund. Following the performance, the group led the audience in a Polonez, and the Anthony Kawalkowski Orchestra (led by another brother member) kept the dance floor full well into the evening. It was a truly wonderful event!

Rich Ciesla, the First Recipient of the Ro Matuszczak Award, Offers His Thanks

I am very pleased that the Chicago Society, PNA, has decided to honor the memory of Romuald Matuszczak, one of our most dedicated and respected members, by establishing this award. I truly respected the work and advocacy that Ro dedicated to the Chicago Society. Since I joined the Society, in 1969, Ro had been on the Board or chairing one of the Society's events for 53 years. Ro was a member since 1956, so that most of us with a history in the Chicago Society know exactly who Ro was. His iconic and gracious greetings to all new and senior members will always be a part of the Chicago Society.

The first I learned of the Chicago Society was in 1967, when the Chicago Intercollegiate Council was invited to dance the Polonez at their Wigilia dinner, held in the Andrew House, located at Division Street and Western Avenue. In fact, that was the first date for me and my wife Maria! The President that year was Ro Matuszczak, serving his first term. It wasn't too long after, actually in 1969, that I became a member, sponsored by John Kalin and Larry Sprengel. In 1971, Ro and a few other members asked me to run in the upcoming election for the Recording Secretary position. Ever since then, I was very active in the Society and in many of the events, developing a long history with the Chicago Society. A few of us members have been President for two separate terms—but Brother Ro had been President for four separate terms, and a total of seven years, a record that I'm sure will never be broken!

On a personal note: Ro was like an older brother to me, and Maria. He and his late wife Halina, and then Chris, were very kind to us in inviting us to celebrate their many family events over the years—including Ro's and Chris' July 4th wedding. He introduced us to so many friends, many no longer here. He assisted us on a number of travels, especially to Poland; and he will forever be "Uncle Ro" to our kids. In our last conversation and visit with Ro, he provided information regarding any future trips to Poland. We definitely miss our calls and conversations, and I am sure that he is looking down on us with approval tonight.

I am very honored and humbled to be the first honoree of this award, and to be honored by an organization to which I have belonged, and worked for, in helping to make it more dedicated and representative of Chicago Polonia. It is a privilege to work toward the Society's established and new philanthropic endeavors. I thank the committee for this honor, and I thank Ro for his friendship, support and encouragement over our many years of service in the Society. And a most gracious "thank you" to all present here tonight—and finally, as Ro always said, "Thanks for Coming!"

The Legion of Young Polish Women is holding its 83rd Annual White and Red Ball, one of the highlights of the local social calendar every year, on Saturday evening, March 4, at the Hilton Hotel, 720 S. Michigan Ave. in downtown Chicago. For anyone wishing to attend, there is still time to purchase tickets for this event, the LYPW's main fundraiser, which makes it possible for them to support charitable, cultural and educational activities throughout the year. The LYPW was honored at the Chicago Society's Evening of Elegance on January 28 for their history of good works, and also were awarded a \$2,000 donation by the Society.

Remember that there is a strictly enforced dress code for this event: formal attire is required, with men wearing tuxedos or tails, and ladies wearing floor-length gowns or ball gowns.

Casimir Pulaski Day Celebration Planned in Niles on March 6

The annual celebration of Casimir Pulaski Day is coming up on Monday, March 6, and the Illinois Divisions of the Polish American Foundation and the Polish American Congress are hosting an event to mark the holiday on that day at the Lone Tree Manor, 7730 N. Milwaukee Ave. in Niles. A cocktail hour will begin at 5:30 p.m., with the program starting at 6 p.m. and dinner at 6:45 p.m.

The holiday honors the contributions of General Kazimierz Pulaski (the original spelling of his name), who fought alongside George Washington during the Revolutionary War, and was known as the "father of the American cavalry." He was credited with saving Washington's life at the Battle of Brandywine in 1777, and was killed two years later during the Battle of Savannah (Georgia) while leading a cavalry charge against British forces. Pulaski Day has been a legal holiday in Illinois since 1986, celebrated on the first Monday in March. In 2009, a joint resolution of the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives, signed by President Obama, made Pulaski an honorary U.S. citizen.

The program in Niles on March 6 will also honor surviving Polish veterans of World War II, who fought for the freedom of Poland as well as ours. Tickets for the event are \$50 per person.
