

Brother **Steve Rakowski**, chairman of the CS Pheasant Hunting Outing, invites fellow members, hunting enthusiasts and friends for our inaugural hunting outing scheduled for Saturday, November 5, 2016 from 8:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m., at Coon Creek Hunt Club, located at 11050 Slough Road, Garden Prairie, Illinois 61038 (near Marengo, IL). Late Fall is a perfect time to pheasant hunt and the Chicago Society has arranged for a great experience for members and friends in one of Northern Illinois' premier hunt clubs. The cost will be \$150.00 per person and our event is limited to the first twenty hunters who deliver their reservation form with a check payable to the PNA-Chicago Society. The hunt will include a guide and three birds per hunter.\* All hunters will also need to have in their possession a one-day hunting license with a habitat stamp.\* Licenses are not available at the Club. We will be meeting at 7:45 a.m. sharp for check-in, release signing, and field assignments. Loaner guns are available on a limited basis on a first-come-first-served basis and arrangements will need to be made prior to the day of the hunt. Only a non-toxic shot is allowed and is available for purchase at the Club. Professional guides with seasoned dogs will be provided for each group as needed. Of course, if you have a hunt-trained dog, you are encouraged to use it.



After the event please stay for a chili lunch and to share pictures and stories of the hunt. \*Additional pheasants are available at \$25/per bird. Please inquire about availability and cost of chucker, quail and partridge. The Phenomenal Blue Lives of the Chicago Police Department! Chicago Police Department (CPD)

Sergeant Bryan Topczewski, who was leaving another homicide scene, heard the call -- "child's been shot" -- and raced toward their house. This was at least the fourth shooting that day, Topczewski said. The sergeant arrived to find a chaotic scene. People were crying and screaming. The 10 year olds family surrounded his small body. "I approached and asked, "Where is he shot?" There were no blood stains soaking through the clothes. I looked at his face and could see blood coming out of his nose," Topczewski said. Topczewski knew from his training there could be internal bleeding. He asked the boy's mother to look for bullet wounds while he ran to his squad car for his medical trauma pack used a trauma pack to save the 10 year old boy. "I ripped the pack open, took out a compression bandage, and I found a wound in his back next to his spine," Topczewski said. "So I just put direct pressure on it." The boy, who loved playing video games and basketball, was fighting for his life with a bullet lodged inside his body. Medics rushed him to the hospital that night, where he underwent several surgeries. Topczewski stopped by to see him and the sight of the boy with tubes going into his body badly disturbed the 20-year Chicago Police Department veteran. "I'm a parent. You don't like to see kids hurt no matter what happens," Topczewski said. "They're the true victims of what goes on here." Bryan is the son of CS Brother and proud father Ronald 'Topper' Topczewski, a retired 30 year Chicago Policeman.

Although unfamiliar with the issue of inclusion of Poland into the U.S. Visa Waiver Program, Trump expressed concern that Poland is not a member of the Program.
